BENAVON BOROUGH

Council Meeting September 15, 2020 Minutes

The Borough of Ben Avon Council met in Regular Session on Tuesday, September 15, 2020 virtually and at 7101 Church Avenue for the purpose of transacting General Business. President Jennifer Bett presided and opened the meeting at 7:06 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

PUBLIC PARTICIPATION

Julie Pintar, 213 Dalzell Avenue

Ms. Pintar shared her concerns on the Airbnb short-term rental property at 207 Dalzell Avenue. While Airbnb has large-group rental restraints in place during COVID, her concern and that of many of her neighbors, is when the restrictions are lifted and the property is once again a nuisance.

Ms. Houska asked council members if they had an opportunity to review the proposed ordinance on small liquor production and if there was any feedback she could take to the Commission at their next meeting.

Ms. Houska also informed council that upon review of JPC finances, the Commission will be requesting funds to cover annual expenses.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Hughes-Holcomb reported multiple discussions over the past few weeks concerning the short-term rental property on Dalzell. She also reported concerns over speeding cars on Dickson Avenue. Mayor Holcomb is scheduled to perform two weddings in the coming weeks, and will report those to council in October.

Mr. Opipery stated that reports have been made to the Police Department concerning a tri-axle truck that has been running a route in the Borough without the proper permits in place.

Chief Hanny stated there were 43 calls in the month of August. He forwards any of interest to those in council to follow during the month. Chief Hanny once again reminded council to spread the word that there have been many calls in Avalon for cars being broken into and even

a report of a stolen vehicle. Steps can be taken to prevent these incidences if folks will lock their cars and remove all valuables.

Mr. Gary Buckman reported the fire company made the final payment on the ladder truck recently. After recent discussions, the VFD has decided not to hold the annual post-Halloween parade luncheon or the haunted house as they have in years past. The Halloween Parade is open for discussion, and as the decision for Trick or Treat will not be made until October, their plans will be on hold until then.

Mr. Opipery reported that the funds reimbursement through the COVID CARES Act was approved and distributed to the Borough in the amount of \$40,000.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Administration Committee

Mrs. Bett reported the Administration Committee meeting will be on Tuesday, September 29, and she will have a report for council at the October Work Session meeting.

Public Affairs/Communications Committee

Mrs. Bett reported that 214 residents were tested in the borough to date, and the positive numbers remain at 12. She encourages all residents to continue to wear masks, keep social distancing practices and CDC recommended handwashing.

Mrs. Bett reminded everyone that although the borough office is closed to foot-traffic, it is staffed and remains operational during the pandemic. Likewise, there have been no interruptions in service with the Public Works Department.

<u>Public Safety/Code Enforcement</u> – See Attachment E

Mr. Casale stated that there are a number of items being followed by the committee. He acknowledged Harshman was doing an great job and their communication with the committee and staff has been excellent.

Public Works Committee

Mr. Opipery reported a letter was sent to West View Water addressing their disregard for following the street opening and restoration procedures as provided them. To date there has

been no response, and after an additional attempt is made, the Borough Solicitor will be asked to take action against them.

Mr. Opipery also noted that the newly ordered leaf loader should be delivered on time for the fall leaf collection in the borough. Mr. Regrut reported to him that the backhoe/highlift needs several repairs that could become costly.

The Public Works Chair also stated that in the coming weeks there will be several advertisements run in the local paper and online to hire two temporary/seasonal part-time laborers and one full-time laborer in the department.

Mr. Wagner stated there was no QVCOG August meeting, however planning continues for the upcoming virtual event fundraiser in October.

Mr. Wagner also reported that he has spoken with Jean-Sebastien Valois from Kilbuck Township and they are working towards a goal of Avon Park improvements focusing on accessibility and safety. Mr. Wagner will discuss further with Mrs. Roggenkamp prior to the meeting.

5. DropBox/budget – We have about \$300 in the account. There was no request last year for funds. With ordinances in progress, we will need to have advertising funds and a shared storage solution. \$500/borough was discussed but a corporate account with longer file recovery time is more expensive. The options and costs will be reviewed by Torn Hyrnda's son.

g. New Business

 Avalon Starbucks & Chase ATM – Chris Stein (Developer) has had the Shell in Bellevue for 20+ years and his goal is to create a positive development as a long-term owner. Felix Cardella (Architect) presented the documents that were distributed via email prior to the meeting: site plan, elevations, and building plan. Stein indicated that they are planning to use the highest end exterior material option.

Kurela asked if there would be a river view from the patio; it is expected that there will be, at least seasonally. Houska mentioned the bike rack ordinance that is in progress and asked if they would consider adding a bike rack; Kara Roggenkamp asked if an EV charging station would be considered. The bike rack seems possible. An EV charging station would have to be investigated; Kara mentioned that there may be grants. Hyrnda mentioned that the back of the site is fill and suggested investigation and caution. The Starbucks is further forward on the site and has a smaller footprint so they do not think they have an issue.

The turn lane is already there but Transit Associates has proposed shifting it if Penn DOT agrees (already submitted) to improve access and potentially overall traffic flow. The land development pre-application package has been submitted to Allegheny County but they are not back in the office yet. Starbucks has the 50% submission. They would like to see the building up by Winter and finish in the Spring with asphalt and landscaping.

Houska noted that there did not seem to be the required parking ordinance green space between the parking lot and Rt 65. They may need an exception for the area directly in front of the building. Kara asked about storm water drainage and the planning process was briefly described. Tulley asked about the current bus stop – will it be moved; is more traffic expected? Transit Associates is doing that evaluation and they will be asked.

- AirBnB Ben Avon is having trouble with enforcement. Fraas will meet with Ben Avon's
 solicitor and perhaps Ben Avon representatives about possible options to resolve the
 problems, including occupancy permitting.
- Solicitor / Engineer rotation Ben Avon will let us know whether they want to take their rotation or pass and have Fraas continue.
- Fireworks Ben Avon will review the state law, which contains distancing requirements from buildings. It seems unlikely that this is a JPC issue but we are happy to provide support.
