### **Council Meeting**

#### **Minutes**

**October 19, 2021**

The Borough of Ben Avon Council met in a regular voting session on Tuesday, October 19, 2021, virtually and at 7101 Church Avenue for the purpose of transacting General Business. Vice President Megan Dolan presided and opened the meeting at 7:01 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

**PUBLIC PARTICIPATION** - *There was no public participation*

#### **BOROUGH REPORTS**

##### Mayor's Report

Mayor Hughes-Holcomb reported a meeting with Chief Hanny, Mr. Wagner, Mr. Opiery and Mr. Sullivan, Ohio Township Manager, to discuss the upcoming police agreement renewal. She stated that Ohio Township Police Chief Hanny continues to keep staff updated and current with renewed policy, procedures and safety measures.

Mayor Holcomb also outlined the plans for the upcoming Borough Halloween parade, and how best to celebrate with the current state of COVID. The annual luncheon at the fire hall will not be held this year to prevent gatherings, but the parade will be held on the 30<sup>th</sup> of October at 11 or 12 p.m. and run from Dickson Avenue to Dalzell Avenue. Candy will be distributed to those children participating.

##### Ohio Township Police Report – See Attachment “A”

Chief Hanny reports a quiet month in the Borough with 50 calls including 9 citations in September. Chief Hanny stated the police will be available to assist with the Halloween festivities once the final details are in place.

Ben Avon Fire Company Report – See Attachment “B”

There was no representative present in violation of past agreement.

Solicitor’s Report

Solicitor Anne Sweeney reported a police contract matter to discuss. Mr. Casale commented there was no need for an Executive Session as the police contract contained no sensitive material. Mr. Opiery shared the details of the contract and reported there will be no tax increase due to the proposed increase in expenses. Mr. Opiery stated the current contract ends this December, and the new contract allows for increases of 2022 - 3.2%, 2023 - 2.6%, 2024 - 2.2%, 2025 - 1.5% and 2026 - 1% to keep up with increasing costs, which is within budget.

Ms. Cieslak reported the Commission is working through the details of the fencing and wall ordinance. JPC representatives received copies of the proposed Climate Action Plan to review and comment. The JPC next meets on Monday, October 25.

Mr. Opiery noted that the sanitary sewer line repair on lower Forest Avenue has been excavated and pipe replaced, with the cost coming in at \$60,000 as previously reported.

## **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

### Administration Report

Ms. Bett reported the Administration Committee will be discussing rental fees for the Borough hall and park pavilion at the November meeting.

### Public Affairs & Communications

Ms. Bett reported updating social media and the website with the leaf collection announcement and the upcoming holidays.

Mayor Hughes-Holcomb noted that Ohio Township Police submits articles for the Ohio Township newsletter, and perhaps some of those submissions may also be appropriate for use in upcoming editions of the Ben Avon Bulletin.

Ms. Cieslak stated the Avon Club thanked the Borough for their help with the annual Fall Festival. She reported Avon Club will review processes and concerns from this year's event, and plan to address several parking and road closure issues for next year. In addition, their Holiday House Tour will be held on December 4.

### Public Safety & Code Enforcement – *See Attachment “D”*

### Public Works

Mr. Pipery reported the paving project for this year is complete other than a few handicapped ramps. Mele and Mele was also able to address a list from the 2019 project and have that complete. He thanked residents for their patience during the project and stressed the importance of cars staying off the street until the asphalt had time to properly cool.

Mr. Pipery said the utility companies are now working on repairs and completing their restoration. The gas company has done all repairs and restoration according to ordinance, West View Water has procured a new contractor to make their designated repairs.

Mr. Pipery stated that although the sewer line on Forest Avenue has been repaired to the best of the Borough's ability, it is still having seepage. Mr. Pipery will contact the Health Department to report what has been done to date, and perhaps schedule a dye test to further investigate the problem.

Mr. Pipery stated the leaf collection is pending and the new Public Works laborer will be starting Monday, October 25. Mr. Santucci continues to work part time to assist with ongoing projects. The leaf program will run until M-T-W prior to Thanksgiving, after which time residents can bag their leaves and place them out with their weekly garbage collection.

Climate Action Plan

Ms. Cieslak requested a deadline for Joint Planning Commission comments on the CAP. Ms. Roggenkamp stated she would like to see the plan adopted by the end of the year, therefore would like comments prior to December's council meeting. Ms. Roggenkamp plans to attend the upcoming JPC meeting on Monday to answer any questions and receive feedback on the plan. Ms. Sweeney asked for clarification on how adopting the plan will impact the community with regards to current ordinances and resolutions. Would it offer more of a guideline rather than a "must do" list? Ms. Roggenkamp explained the intent more related to outreach and education, not mandates.

**Executive Director's Report – October 2021**

**Annual Dinner** - The QVCOG Annual Dinner will occur on Wednesday, October 20, 2021 at the Edgeworth Club (511 East Drive, Edgeworth, PA 15143). The QVCOG would like to thank Mr. Kevin Flannery for sponsoring the event. The keynote speakers for the event will be Senator Devlin Robinson (PA-37) & Representative Anita Kulik (PA-45). Two raffles will occur with generated proceeds going towards 412 Food Rescue. Additional information concerning the event including registration details can be found at [qvcog.org](http://qvcog.org) or by emailing [pconners@qvcog.org](mailto:pconners@qvcog.org).

**QVCOG Police Chiefs Training** – On October 7<sup>th</sup> the Allegheny County Police Department conducted a presentation for QVCOG Police Chiefs and departmental representatives concerning critical incident response and procedures. The event occurred at the Bellevue Borough Building. The event was a success with nearly every QVCOG municipality being represented. It is anticipated that quarterly meetings for QVCOG Police Chiefs will occur moving forward.

**Gaming Economic Development Fund Grant Application** - The Gaming Economic Development Tourism Fund (GEDTF) application period is now open and will run through **October 22, 2021**. This Grant allows municipalities and councils of government (COGs) to carry out important economic development projects for current and future use. Administered by the Redevelopment Authority of Allegheny County (RAAC), these grants provide financial assistance to entities to facilitate economic development projects within Allegheny County. This Grant stream has no income requirement and all QVCOG member communities can apply! Eligible projects can be found below.

- A. Economic Development Projects: Projects that promote local economic activity and create and/or retain jobs;
- B. Infrastructure Development Projects: Projects that improve or create infrastructure;
- C. Job Training: Workforce development projects;
- D. Community Improvement Projects: Projects that improve or create civic, cultural, or recreational activities or facilities;
- E. Public Safety Projects: Projects that promote the safety of affected communities;
- F. Public Interest Projects: Projects that improve the quality of life in the affected communities; and
- G. Projects with a \$150,000.00 project budget or greater.

**Traveling Glass Dumpster (Avalon Borough)** – From October 30<sup>th</sup> through November 5<sup>th</sup> Avalon Borough has partnered in sponsoring a traveling glass dumpster provided by the Pennsylvania Resources Council (PRC). The dumpster will be located at Avalon's Public Works Garage (between Frederick Street & New Brighton Road Avalon, PA 15202).

**2022-26 Waste & Recycling Contract** – The new Waste & Recycling Contract is set to commence on January 1, 2022. For those municipalities participating within the aforementioned contract, a Resolution outlining the desired service package and a executed Agreement with Waste Management are due by the end of this month. Should you have any questions concerning the Contract or required approval documents please reach out to Executive Director Connors ASAP.

**COG-Wide GIS Zoning Map** – An accessible GIS map is available for all QVCOG member municipalities.
