

The Borough of Ben Avon Council met in a regular voting session on Tuesday, October 18, 2022, virtually and at 7101 Church Avenue for the purpose of transacting General Business. President Richard Wagner presided and opened the meeting at 7:00 PM with the Pledge of Allegiance.

## **BOROUGH REPORTS**

<u>Mayor's Report</u> Mayor Holcomb thanked the Emsworth Fire Company for a job well done at their recent fire awareness event.

In planning for Halloween, the Mayor reported that she was not able to secure the Avonworth marching band this year due to scheduling conflicts but hopes to work something out for next years' event. She asked council members for volunteers to fill candy bags and asked both the police and fire chief for their assistance with the parade. Emsworth Fire Company will head up the parade and Ohio Township police will follow participants at the end of the parade.

Ohio Township Police Report - See Attachment "A"

Chief Hanny reported 49 calls in Ben Avon this month. He noted there would be another road closure on I79 northbound this evening.

Mr. Wagner asked Chief Hanny to clarify what, if any, involvement Ohio Township Police have had in the past of complaints of roaming cats. Chief Hanny stated that officers had passed out flyers and copies of the domestic animal ordinance and spoke to residents concerning these complaints. He stated that many of the stray cats are being fed by a resident. Mr. Wagner stated there are not a lot of options for the Borough to address this problem, and Mayor Holcomb said she would forward information on a TNR (tag, neuter, release) program to President Wagner.

<u>Emsworth Volunteer Fire Company Report</u> – *See Attachment "B"* Chief Kohl reported three calls in the Borough this month. He stated that their participation in the Fall Festival seemed to go well.

## Joint Planning Commission

Ms. Cieslak stated there will be an informational session on October 26 via zoom with representatives from General Code. In addition, she noted:

- The proposal to codify zoning estimate is around \$8,000.
- JPC shared all estimated expenses for 2023 budget planning.
- JPC received municipalitie's comments on the pending ordinances, with the next step to go to Allegheny County before they open to public comments.
- One Avalon representative stepped down from serving on the commission.

## **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

### Administration Report

Ms. Bett thanked Council members for their assistance during the Fall Festival. Mayor Holcomb reported that several residents stated they did not receive a copy of the most recent newsletter, but upon review, she cannot identify any problem with the mailing list. Mr. Kuehner stated he will meet with the Borough Secretary this coming week to review questions on the proposed fee schedule.

### Public Affairs & Communications

Ms. Bett reported she is awaiting a proposal from a web development company. She also recently reached out to the Pitt graduate program for web assistance, however, has not yet received a response.

## Public Safety – See Attachment "C"

Mr. Wagner referred to the code enforcement report received from Harshman this month. Ongoing efforts to improve communications and record keeping with Harshman appear to show improvement. Mr. Wagner continues to work with the property owner of the temporary fence on Church and Breading to reach a resolution.

#### Public Works

Mr. Opipery reported that the paving project scheduled for this Fall has been postponed until Spring of 2023. He asked the Borough Secretary to mail letters to those residents affected by the change, and the Borough will again notify them when the project is rescheduled. In the meantime, sewer work will take place on Walnut Road, and patching of some of the roads will be done soon. Mele will assist with those repairs that will ensure the roads to be in good repair for the winter months.

The wall repair on Brighton Road is awaiting utility pole relocation in the coming week.

Mr. Opipery also stated the Public Works crew has started leaf collection for the year. He said they had a limited number of responses for the full-time Public Works position and would like to explore other avenues to search for potential candidates.

#### Community of Governments

Mr. Wagner reported the annual COG dinner was well attended, and donations were accepted for a local food bank. He stated there was a budget meeting last week, and the delegate meeting will be tomorrow.

#### Sustainability

Ms. Roggenkamp stated the committee has not recently met; however, she continues to work on the Borough Hall energy information. Mr. Thornton asked the Council to please respond to the request to sign Act 101 letter to the state in a request to renew and standardize recycling laws.

## Special Projects

## Building Project

Mr. Wagner reported two bids were received for Phase I of the building renovations. Each bidder provided several options. At this point they are unsure if the roof needs repairs or replaced and it will have to be evaluated. Ms. Roggenkamp would like to have the Council consider upgrading the insulation as budget permits.

#### Avon Park Enhancements

Mr. Wagner referenced a list generated by the park survey which was available on the Borough website. He would like to have input from the Public Works perspective. Mr. Wagner hopes to send a list and letter to Kilbuck Township supervisors with the ideas for proposed enhancements and request a meeting to begin the process of using the money donated by the pipeline company and earmarked for those park improvements.

#### **NEW BUSINESS**

#### Verizon Cell Tower

Mr. Wagner reported he recently received contact through a third party that Verizon is interested in placing a 5G tower in the Borough. He suggested that the representative may want to attend an upcoming work session meeting to discuss plans and answer questions.

#### **OLD BUSINESS**

#### Ordinance 792 – Tax Act 57

### The Citizen

Ms. Connie Rankin addressed the Council and shared that at the end of 2022, *The Citizen* will no longer have a printed copy format and will be strictly digital. With the requirement by the state that legal advertising must be in a printed copy of record, she will not be able to provide legal advertising for the municipalities. As we are approaching budget season, she wanted to alert the Council that the cost of legal advertising for the Boroughs will increase substantially and will need to be factored into the budgeting process. She thanked Council for their continued support of the paper.
