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May 19, 2020 Council Meeting Minutes

CALL TO ORDER

BOROUGH REPORTS

Mayors Report – report given by Mayor Melanie Holcomb

Mayor Holcomb reported that she spoke to the Allegheny County Board of Elections and the voting machines will be delivered tomorrow to the Fire Hall.

Mayor Holcomb also reported an incident with a child on a bike who was not obeying the safety laws and was injured by an oncoming car. While the youngster was taken to the hospital, the injuries were not considered to be life-threatening.

The Administration committee met to work out the job responsibilities and advertisement for the borough secretary's replacement.

Chief Hanny reported the month of April had few calls – 48 in all – and nothing of great concern.

Mr. Opipery reported nothing exceptional on the statements reviewed by council.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

<u>Administration Report</u> - report given by Jennifer Bett

Mrs. Bett reported that although Allegheny County was working to consolidate polling locations for the June 2 primary election, Ben Avon's polling location will not change.

Mrs. Bett reminded all that the borough office remains closed to the public and work continues remotely until further notice. Anyone wishing to contact the borough may do so through email or a phone call.

Public Affairs/Communications Committee – report given by Jennifer Bett

Mrs. Bett stated she continues to monitor the developments of COVID-19 as the health and well-being of the residents and staff are of the utmost priority. As of this date, there have been 29 tests known to be conducted with 0 confirmed cases in the borough.

<u>Public Safety/Code Enforcement</u> – report given by David Stoeckle

Mr. Stoeckle reported two new complaints to the borough, which were forwarded to Harshman CE Group to follow. Violation notices have been issued to those out of compliance. Mr. Stoeckle also noted that he and Mr. Casale met with Jarrod D'Amico from Harshman on a conference call to discuss and reinforce protocols going forward.

<u>Public Works</u> - report given by Ken Opipery

Mr. Opipery reported Dale Regrut, PW Supervisor, has returned under light duty. The PW crew is keeping up with all maintenance issues, and Dale is in contact with them. Mr. Opipery also noted he is available for them if they cannot reach Dale.

QV COG Report – report given by Rick Wagner

Mr. Wagner reported on the visioning session with the COG concerning the impacts of COVID-19 on municipal finances, COG sustainability, and responses to the survey sent out to local government officials. One area of concern was the upcoming contract negotiaitions with Waste Management. Mr. Wagner also stated there was discussion of other ways the COG can be of service to the members.

Mr. Wagner forwarded information to council members regarding the meeting on May 20 that would center around greenspace connectivity – connecting trails in Allegheny County.

NEW BUSINESS

Memorial Day Observance

Mayor Holcomb reported the American Legion contacted the borough concerning a very small recognition ceremony to be held at the war memorial that they wished to perform on the morning of Memorial Day. Mrs. Holcomb asked that residents decorate and participate from a distance to show respect and gratitude.

<u>Annual Fireworks Donation</u>

Mrs. Bett reported the borough office was contacted by Mr. Lee Nelson inquiring about the annual donation for the cancelled July 4 fireworks display. Mr. Nelson asked if the borough would consider keeping the donation in place if they postponed until Labor Day. Some discussion followed, with most members asking for more information concerning the type and size of celebration being planned.

Avonworth High School Seniors

Mayor Holcomb reported plans for the upcoming Avonworth Seniors parade would be reviewed by Chief Hanny and any concerns addressed. The parade was scheduled June 5, with a rain date of June 6.

Primary Election Day

Mrs. Bett reminded all that the primary election is June 2 and folks have until next Monday to register for a mail-in ballot.
